It is the season for graduations. A number of pastors in the Presbytery of Lake Erie are celebrating graduations. Take the time to extend your congratulations to them.

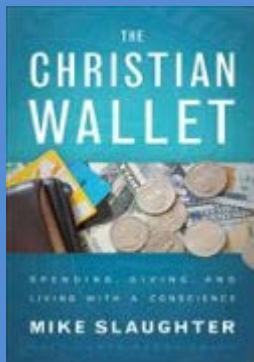

### **Good News about Your Generosity in 2017!!**

We are already ¼ of the way through 2017! And it is good to celebrate the financial faithfulness of the congregations of Lake Erie Presbytery! At the end of March a total of \$32,008 has been received through general mission giving in the first three months of the year – about on schedule with what is anticipated. Five churches have already fulfilled their pledge for the year! Thanks! About \$11,500 is needed per month to reach the mission goal for the year. YOUR GIFTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN TELLING THE STORY OF THE GOOD NEWS OF JESUS CHRIST! Mission travel and energy efficiency grants are funded through your mission gifts. Children are fed and ecumenical campus ministry is engaged. Thank you!

On the per capita side there is additional good news of financial faithfulness. About \$19,100 is needed each month to meet budget expectations. During the first three months of the year a total of \$70,208 was received, including 14 churches that have already been able to fulfill their total per capita commitment for the year. This is slightly ahead of budget expectation which is unusual this time of year. Thank you for your faithful support – even paying advance when possible! And thank you for making all payments before the end of the year!

### With Sadness...

The recent death of key former leaders has had an impact on the Presbytery of Lake Erie.

- Virginia Edwards, wife of Rev. John Edwards, died on April 3. Virginia had a keen intellect and passion for learning. Her husband was the long time pastor of the Sarah Hearn Presbyterian Church and had preceded his wife in death by 11 years. A service to honor Virginia's life was held at Wayside Presbyterian Church on April 6.
- Ruling Elder Betty Irvin, charter member of the Wayside Church, died on February 26. Professionally she served as a nurse for many years but she was also known to many Presbyterians as the registrar at presbytery meetings in the 1980s and 1990s. She was a pleasant presence who always welcomed people in a kind fashion and an affirming smile. A service to honor her life will be celebrated at Wayside Church on March 18.
